Critical Skills Diver : Sept 15-16 (\$450)

CSD training focuses on building in-water confidence through repetition, emphasizing muscle memory, stress responses, and emergency preparedness. Students practice key skills to prevent and manage diving emergencies effectively.



Surface Supplied Air : Sept 17-19 (\$550)

This course provides comprehensive training on the use of surface-supplied systems, including full-face masks, underwater communication, and emergency procedures, with hands-on practice in classroom, pool, and open-water settings.



Evidence Recovery Operations : Sept 20-21 (\$450)

Gain advanced skills in underwater evidence recovery, including crime scene management, evidence preservation, and the application of specialized search and recovery techniques.



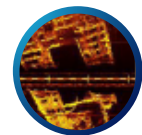
Light Salvage & Recovery : Sept 22-24 (\$550)

This program focuses on advanced salvage operations, emphasizing environmentally conscious recovery of vehicles, aircraft, and boats using specialized equipment and techniques.



Deep Dive Operations : Sept 25-27 (\$450)

Designed for PSDs, this program establishes the foundational knowledge and skills for planning and conducting open circuit, no-decompression scuba dives up to 130 feet.



Humminbird Sonar Technician : Sept 28-29 (\$450)

Develop the skills to maximize Humminbird sonar systems for underwater search operations, including setup, usage, image interpretation, and training with victim imagery.

PREREQUISITES

- At least 18 Years of Age
- Member of a Public Safety Agency
- RSTC Medical Statement
- Open Water Certification
- Physically Fit (13 MET or greater recommended)

BRING TO CLASS

US Coast Guard approved PFD with knife and whistle, adequate clothing and protection from the environment and pen and paper for note-taking and sketching.

Diving students must provide their own equipment:

Wetsuit or dry suit, scuba regulator: recently serviced + environmentally protected with alternate air source (i.e.: octopus), timing device, depth + submersible pressure gauge, BC with oral/power inflator, 4 tanks with current Hydro + VIP, mask, snorkel, fins, weight belt + 2 cutting tools (knife, wire cutters, or trauma shears).
