

OBJECTIVE

The Dive Rescue II course is an intensive five-to-six-day program combining advanced rescue, current diving, and light salvage operations into one comprehensive training.

Designed for public safety divers, this course equips participants with the skills to use specialized technical and lifting equipment, execute advanced rescue and recovery techniques, and safely navigate complex water-related incidents. Training includes classroom, pool, and open-water environments, where students practice skills such as hydrology and moving water dynamics, hazard assessment, self-rescue, preplanning, underwater rigging, and salvage lifting techniques. The program also emphasizes environmentally conscious salvage operations, teaching participants how to recover vehicles, boats, and aircraft while preserving underwater crime scenes and supporting investigations. By mastering anchoring, high-line, and lifting techniques, your team will be prepared to tackle challenging operations safely and effectively.

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MAKING IT HAPPEN

PREREQUISITES

- At least 18 years of age
- Member of a Public Safety Agency
- RSTC Medical Statement
- Open Water Certification
- Physically fit (13 MET or greater recommended)

BRING TO CLASS

US Coast Guard approved PFD with knife and whistle, adequate clothing and protection from the environment and pen and paper for note-taking and sketching.

Diving students must provide their own equipment :

Wetsuit or dry suit, scuba regulator: recently serviced + environmentally protected with alternate air source (i.e.: octopus), timing device, depth + submersible pressure gauge, BC with oral/power inflator, 4 tanks with current Hydro + VIP, mask, snorkel, fins, weight belt + 2 cutting tools (knife, wire cutters, or trauma shears).

TRAVEL

Check with Dive Rescue International to confirm class before making airline reservations.
