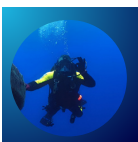

### Public Safety Scuba Instructor (PSSI): June 8-12 (\$1350)

Dive Rescue International's Public Safety Scuba Instructor (PSSI) program is an intensive, five-day course designed to prepare experienced divers to train and certify Public Safety Divers (PSDs) within their own departments. Graduates gain the skills to teach open water fundamentals with a focus on rescue and recovery operations, ensuring their teams are equipped to handle challenging environments such as zero visibility and contaminated waters.



### Dive Rescue 1 Trainer (DR1-T): June 15-19 (\$1350)

The Dive Rescue 1 Trainer (DR1T) program is an intensive leadership course designed for experienced scuba instructors aiming to certify their department personnel as Dive Rescue 1 Specialists. This program introduces specialized teaching techniques tailored to the educational needs of emergency services adult learners, enhancing instructors' abilities to foster a positive learning environment. Graduates will be equipped to teach and certify divers in the fundamentals of dive team operations, ensuring their teams are prepared for effective and safe responses to water-related emergencies.



### Med Dive 1 Trainer (MD1-T): June 20 (\$500)

The Med Dive 1 Trainer (MD1T) program equips instructors with the expertise to teach the Med Dive 1 course, focusing on the recognition and initial management of diving-related medical emergencies such as decompression illness and arterial gas embolism. This certification enables trainers to deliver in-house instruction to their departments and collaborate with mutual aid agencies, enhancing the readiness and safety of public safety dive teams.

#### PREREQUISITES

- Sponsorship by a Public Safety Agency
- At least 21 years old
- Current Dive Rescue 1 certification
- Completion of Med Dive [must be 2 day (20 hour) course]
- A minimum of 100 logged dives (at least 50% must be training/operational dives while remaining 50% can be recreational dives with only 2 pool dives/year acceptable)
- Current First Aid, EMT or Paramedic certification
- Current CPR certification

**BRING TO CLASS** US Coast Guard approved PFD with knife and whistle, adequate clothing and protection from the environment and pen and paper for note-taking and sketching.

**Diving students must provide their own equipment:** Wetsuit or dry suit, scuba regulator: recently serviced + environmentally protected with alternate air source (i.e.: octopus), timing device, depth + submersible pressure gauge, BC with oral/power inflator, 4 tanks with current Hydro + VIP, mask, snorkel, fins, weight belt + 2 cutting tools (knife, wire cutters, or trauma shears).
